A CALL TO COME TOGETHER

For we are God's fellow workers..." 1 Corinthians 3:9

In October 1969, the Beatles released a song entitled, "Come Together," the opening track of their famous Abbey Road album. Though the song was initially intended to serve as the theme for Timothy Leary's gubernatorial run in California, that plan was scrapped when Leary dropped out of the race. Instead, John Lennon drafted lyrics he referred to as "gobbledygook," and "Come Together" became the Beatles' 18th number one hit on the Billboard Hot 100 charts, surpassing Elvis Presley's previous record of 17. Despite the song's unconventional creation and abstract composition, fans all over the world misinterpreted its chorus (which says, "Come together, right now, over me") as a call for unity – a perception that continues even today.

Though John Lennon was not trying to bring people together through that song, I most certainly am through this ministry. Reaching our potential as an association of churches is contingent upon our willingness to work cooperatively. Individually, each church in the Upper Ohio Valley Baptist Association (UOVBA) is an important part of God's Kingdom and, to be sure, will have an impact on eternity. However, our 22 churches can do far more by working together. How? Let me share a few opportunities that highlight the potential of cooperative ministry.

DISASTER RELIEF

Disaster relief efforts are currently underway in the southeastern portion of our association. The towns of McMechen, Hundred, and Mannington have all been hit very hard by recent flooding. Cameron Baptist Church and Temple Baptist Church have opened their doors to disaster relief teams representing the West Virginia Convention of Southern Baptists (WVCSB), while Indian Creek Southern Baptist Church has been busy mobilizing disaster relief volunteers. Together, Southern Baptists are providing meals, supplies, cleanup efforts, and Gospel ministry to the vic-tims of this disaster. 
Trailer Reservations

Over the last few months, our team at the association has been working hard to provide resources that can benefit the church to equip you in ministry. With many of us being online daily we thought that we should look to see how we could utilize our website to serve our local churches better. Praying about this we came up with some useful tools when it comes to our trailer ministry.

Each year especially during the summer months our trailers at the association are being reserved for various activities around the valley. Previously, each time a trailer needed to be reserved you had to call or email the office at the association to see if the trailer you needed was available and to reserve your dates. In some cases, this may have taken a couple of days to confirm because of office hours and time to reply to email.

We have now found a way to empower the local church by moving our reservation process completely online. By clicking on "Association Trailers" in the top section of UOVBA.com you will be directed to the trailer reservation process. When there you will be able to see the trailer dates available and start the reservation process.

In addition to reserving a trailer, we have also provided an online training process for our block party inflatables. When you select the "Bounce House Training" you will be able to go through some basic training. Safety forms, manuals & training videos are available for you to complete your block party training. Once you have reviewed the safety forms and videos you can complete the certification by filling out an online form directly from that page. Please remember that anyone who operates a bounce house needs to be certified.

Our middle son, Josh, has been witnessing to his girlfriend, who is unsaved and unchurched.




